What does 'reprieve' mean?



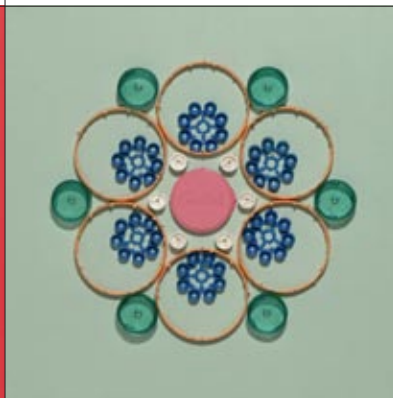
**Glenys Hodgeman
